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State budget Dilemma: A Case for Retaining the Manufacturer's Investment Tax Credit (MIC)

A Letter from LAEDC President and CEO Lee Harrington

Business as Usual?

During the past weeks I have journeyed to Sacramento twice to convey to political leaders and industry associations some of the LAEDC'S insights relative to the budget crisis and the issue of business friendliness in California. We have been particularly supportive of continuation of the Manufacturer's Investment Tax Credit (MIC) as an attraction and retention tool. During the past two years the LAEDC has worked more than 120 projects in the manufacturing sector. Of these, about 40 projects involved use of the MIC. About one-third were attractions. Two-thirds were retentions. More important, these 40 projects involved over 60% of the jobs at risk in the 120 projects. We have tried to explain that incentives like this are even more important when other costs like electric rates, workers compensation, eight-hour overtime rules, etc. are rising.

What our political leaders often fail to realize is that this is not just about businesses closing or leaving. This is about people being laid off. These dislocations are the costliest of all. The average manufacturing worker makes around \$17.50 an hour, \$35,000 per year, generally with benefits. Each worker generates \$2,500 annually to the state in both state income and sales taxes. And there are almost one million manufacturing workers in Southern California. Unfortunately, that is 290,000 less than in 1989, which translates to \$725 million less in state revenues due to the job losses, let alone the corporate income and capital gain taxes forgone.

Everyone assumes that other business will quickly move in to fill the loss. Eventually, due to the incredible entrepreneurial spirit in California, our huge market, institutional resources and our global access, new business will be started and/or come and grow here. But in the meantime, a lot of hardworking peoples' lives will be disrupted by businesses having to make difficult decisions. And tax revenue will be lost at a time when every such dollar is precious.

In the meantime the LAEDC and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors will be meeting with our business base to let them know we appreciate them and want to help them succeed and grow. After all, businesses friendliness is really about the people working for our businesses.



Mission Statement:

The LAEDC is a private non-profit organization. As the premier business leadership organization, the LAEDC's mission is to attract, retain and grow businesses and jobs in the regions of Los Angeles County, as well as identifying trends and affecting positive change for the local economy.

Since 1995, the LAEDC has helped in the creation of 56,6732 jobs from 278 projects. The economic impact of those jobs translates into \$1.9 billion in salaries and more than \$222 million in tax revenue generated to support schools and local government in the LA County region, annually.



The annual estimated economic impact of salaries from direct jobs created is \$284,706,576 and annual tax revenue totals \$5,264,473. The team completed a number of site searches representing more than 3 million square feet, 251 acres and 1,411 potential new jobs.

More than 219 businesses requested Technical Assistance. The assistance was given in the areas of general business consulting, marketing and promotion, permitting, licensing, hiring, training, and incentives, referrals to RBAN providers and the distribution of Business Resource Guides. The Team is actively working on 201 projects representing 24,738 jobs. The BAP program is free to businesses in Los Angeles County.


