Dr. Patrick Soon-Shiong, The Boeing Company to be Honored for Business Leadership by LAEDC at 14th Annual Eddy Awards®

Founder and Executive Chairman of Abraxis BioScience and The Boeing Company receive top honors for their economic development leadership and job creation in L.A. County

Los Angeles, CA — The Los Angeles County Economic Development Corporation (LAEDC) has announced **Patrick Soon-Shiong, M.D.**, Executive Chairman of Abraxis Bioscience (**NASDAQ: ABII**) and CEO of Abraxis Health as its individual honoree and **The Boeing Company (NYSE:BA)** as its corporate honoree for the 14th Annual Eddy Awards®. Established in 1996, the annual gala has become the most important economic development award program in the state of California. This year's celebration pays tribute to leaders of two vital technology sectors, life sciences and aerospace, which will play a critical role in the region's economic recovery.

The 14th Annual Eddy Awards® will be held on Thursday, November 12, 2009, at the Beverly Hilton.

He developed the revolutionary drug Abraxane that uses a patented nanotechnology delivery system which eliminates the toxic side effects of previously used pharmaceuticals and delivers anti-cancer drugs directly to cancer cells, rather than healthy cells.

Dr. Soon-Shiong is a co-inventor of over 50 issued U.S. patents, has published more than 100 scientific papers, and is a founder of two publicly-traded, multi-billion dollar pharmaceutical companies, American Pharma Partners and Abraxis Bioscience. His innovation and research in the medical field have been recognized with numerous national and international awards.

The companies he founded have created hundreds of jobs for Los Angeles County and the life-giving research and technologies developed under his leadership have helped to save countless lives. Dr. Soon-Shiong epitomizes the entrepreneurial spirit on which Los Angeles was founded and the success that can be achieved through hard work and perseverance.

Dr. Soon-Shiong was recently appointed Executive Director of the UCLA Wireless Health Institute and is Professor of Microbiology, Immunology, and Molecular Genetics Professor of Bioengineering at UCLA. In 2009, he was appointed to the President's Council at the RAND Corporation, is Chairman of the Steering Committee of Life Sciences of the X-Prize Foundation, and a Founding Board member to the Dossia Foundation.

"Patrick Soon-Shiong continues to push the bounds of the medical industry," said Allen. "His research and companies have played a key role in the advancement of the bioscience industry in Los Angeles County in addition to creating countless jobs for Angelenos. We are proud to honor Dr. Soon-Shiong for his unwavering commitment to L.A. County through his philanthropic contributions, medical advances, and economic leadership."

In addition to recognizing Dr. Soon-Shiong and The Boeing Company, the LAEDC will announce the winners of the 4th Annual "*Most Business-Friendly City in Los Angeles County*" competition live at the Eddy Awards. Last year, Santa Clarita and Vernon won the "*Most Business-Friendly City*" recognition for cities with populations of more than 50,000 residents and less than 50,000, respectively.
