The County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors provides business enterprises owned by minorities, women, disadvantaged and disabled veterans maximum opportunity to participate in the County's contracting and procurement programs.

Getting Started. The process to apply to become a CBE business is simple and free. First, apply for CBE certification and submit any needed documentation. Visit http://laosb.org/PDFs/CBE_ **Program_Application.pdf** for the online application.

To be eligible to participate in the County of Los Angeles CBE Program, a business must either be certified as a:

Minority and/or Women-Owned Business Enterprise

To qualify, your business must be 51% owned by one or more minorities and/or women, and must be managed by, and the daily business operations controlled by, one or more minorities or women. Please review the CBE application for gualifications.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise or

Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise
