LEAN MANUFACTURING What is it?

Put simply, Lean Manufacturing or Lean is the method of eliminating waste. If you manufacture or provide a product to a customer, you produce waste, often at every stage of your product cycle. Waste includes:

- Overproduction
- Lost time
- Employee inefficiency
- Overprocessing

In the 1990's Lean Manufacturing in part, stemmed from the process developed by Toyota. Known as the Toyota Production System or TPS, Toyota created a Lean culture by which every employee, from the office personnel to the assembly line worker to the truck driver, adhered to-continuously.

Grand Opening–LAEDC Success Story



LAEDC, along with the City of Industry and the Health Department come together to help a local restaurant make their grand opening deadline.



Shanxi Noodle House is a new restaurant in the City of Industry that celebrated their grand opening on Saturday, December 19, 2015.

This opening date was very important as they were hosting a large Chinese delegation to kick-off the grand opening of this new restaurant.

A week prior to the opening, the owners were running into delays with the city relative to the sign and occupancy permits as well as final inspection from county health department.

The restaurant was told it could be weeks before the final permits and inspection could be completed thereby threatening the planned grand opening of the business.

LAEDC was introduced to the project. LAEDC was able to work with city planning department at the eleventh hour to expedite the approval of the sign permit and coordinated with the Health department for final inspection and occupancy approval.

The restaurant met their deadline for their grand opening and now employ 20 workers.
