






Incomes Up, Drive Consumer Spending



U.S. Total New Vehicle Sales






Federal Budget Receipts and Outlays as % of GDP







GDP, constant prices (percent change)




U.S. In Full Employment Range





U.S. Nonfarm Job Growth







First Significant Wage Gains vs. Inflation




Real Household Income Trending Down

Earnings/Unemployment by Education







Stock Market Volatility Up




Crude Oil Prices 2007-Present




California Growth Outpacing U.S.





CA Unemployment Rate Falling Quickly





The Drought & El Nino?

- California Drought
 - Immediate effects of drought mainly on agriculture
 - Long run concerns re: drought
- El Nino & California Drought
 - Above normal rain in Southern California
 - Need precipitation in Sierras



The Drought & El Nino?

- El Nino & The Price of Your 2 PM Chocolate Bar
 - West Africa: 70% of global supply of cocoa
 - Ecuador also significant producer
 - Forecast: Global supply down 2% due to El Nino
 - Expect price of cocoa beans to rise




Local Unemployment Rates






Job Trends by Industry – Los Angeles


YTY percent change in nonfarm employment by industry








Container Throughput San Pedro Bay Ports



Southern California Transportation and Warehousing Employment




Motion Picture & Sound Recording Employment in Los Angeles County









Value of Manufacturing Output – California






Apartment Rents – Southern California



Residential Building Permits Issued in Los Angeles County




Residential Building Permits Issued in Orange County



Residential Building Permits Issued in the Inland Empire




Southern California Construction Employment

Industrial Vacancy Rates – Southern California








LA County Nonfarm Employment
