# A Cyber Attack on your Business—Are you Ready?

If you store personal information in your network, travel with laptops and smartphones, or process credit card transactions, your company is at risk.

No matter the size of the business, all companies are at risk for a cyber attack. Now more than ever, 24/7 attention is needed to keep your data, and your customer's data safe. The ten steps below, including a company continuity plan can go a long way to keep you safe, and when a breach does occur, get your business back up and running faster.







### 1. ROBUST BACKUP

More than just copying files to a second drive, create a complete "mirror" backup of your systems and use additional **CLOUD** backups Finding the Best Backup Option for Your Small Business Data\*



### 2. EMPLOYEE POLICY PLAN

Establish policies and procedures for:

- 1. Laptop, tablet and phone handling
- 2. Creation of passwords
- 3. Delete old employee accounts



#### 3. MANAGE PASSWORDS

- **1.** Safeguard passwords in protected software or Cloud
- **2.** Use different passwords Can't remember? Use phrases
- 3. Don't save passwords in browsers



# 4. PATCHES / UPDATES

- **1.** Keep web browsers and software current with security updates
- **2.** Equip your computers with antivirus software and antispyware and update regularly



# 5. BUSINESS CONTINUITY PLAN

Make a plan in case of attack to keep your business running. Is your data available off-site or in the cloud? What people are in charge of which tasks?



### 6. KNOW YOUR DATA

- **1.** Know where your important data is stored
- 2. Invest in data loss protection software
- **3.** Test backup recovery systems



#### 7. FIREWALL

Make sure your firewalls change as your data grows



# 8. EMAIL PRACTICE

Do not click on unknown email links or download unknown attachments



## 8. DEVICES

Train employees on secure use of mobile devices that leave the company. 10 Ways to Keep Your Mobile Devices More Secure\*



### 10. DATA DISPOSAL

- 1. Shred all important paper documents rather than using a trash bin
- **2.** Destroy old computer devices and drives

**CFR Rinkens** provides global door-to-door shipping solutions for any cargo. They are known for their

expertise in classic car and new vehicle transportation, and have vast experience in commercial freight and oversize cargo. The main operation is in the City of Paramount with locations and warehouse operations in Northern California and Miami, and in Europe. Firm has over 70 local employees and over 140 employees companywide.

**The Challenge.** Like other firms in the logistics and transportation industry, the company was facing significant cost increases and looking for solutions to address critical challenges. A priority was identifying options over renewing the lease at the Paramount site or move out of the area. If a major move was on plan, then firm would need to allow adequate time and resources to run parallel operations. If the lease would not be renewed, the local operation was at risk. The company's management was interested in a wide range of resources including access to capital, permitting, insurance, labor supply and employee training.

- Introduced no cost services offered by local <u>America's Job Center of California</u> and presented employee training options and workforce programs
- Introduced insurance broker to review risk management program including Workers Comp, Property Casualty, etc.
- Introduced <u>LA County Community</u> <u>Development Commission programs</u>, as well as local bankers
