W

hen the Blackstone Charitable Foundation's team came to Los Angeles in 2013 with the idea of fostering the next generation to start new businesses and increase job creation in the region, they had everyone's attention. And they followed through with a program that has positively impacted California's shared future and helped launch over 120 companies thus far.

The Blackstone LaunchPad concept of mentoring, advising, and connecting young entrepreneurs reinforces our fundamental belief about America -- that we are a country of opportunity and economic mobility where innovation and risk taking are encouraged and rewarded, and success comes out of hard work and collaboration.

Through the Blackstone LaunchPad program, three of our region's leading universities have been able to provide an even greater number of students with a pathway to entrepreneurial success, many of whom would only have dreamed of starting companies, but never ventured to do so without the program's encouragement and resources. The program has helped those dreams become real, creating hundreds of jobs, with the prospect that these entrepreneurs will move forward to start more companies and create many more jobs in the future as well.

Beyond its LaunchPad program, the Blackstone Charitable Foundation also facilitated the development of the Center for Innovation at Los Angeles County Economic Development Corporation (LAEDC), and *InnovateLA*, an annual event (or rather a collection of more than 150 discrete events) celebrating the innovation ecosystem in our region. Through these programs, we are developing connections between the region's innovation stakeholders to accelerate their progress and that of the Southern California region.

In total, the Blackstone Charitable Foundation has had an impact on hundreds of individual students, added a new dimension to our universities, contributed to a rapidly growing startup culture in L.A., and spawned successful programs like *InnovateLA*. In our role as regional coordinator for the Blackstone LaunchPad program, we honor Blackstone's commitment, are overjoyed to see so many students newly engaged in job creation, and we are humbled by the opportunity to facilitate growth of regional entrepreneurship, which so closely supports our vision of raising standards of living for our region's residents by increasing economic opportunity and regional prosperity.

Within these pages we document the progress delivered by Blackstone LaunchPad, which is strengthening and maturing at three universities: University of Southern California (USC), University of California-Los Angeles (UCLA), and University of California-Irvine (UCI).


WHAT IS LaunchPad?

In 2015, the Blackstone Charitable Foundation continued its support of Los Angeles entrepreneurs by sponsoring LA Innovation Week. The event, which celebrates innovative thinking and doing all over the Los Angeles region, consisted of 160 events, 656 hours of programming, and had over 25,000 attendees.

OVERVIEW OF BLACKSTONE LAUNCHPAD SOCAL

Based on the LaunchPad program developed by the University of Miami, Blackstone LaunchPad at USC, UCLA, and UC Irvine initially pairs students with consultants who help them develop their business ideas. As their ideas mature, students are then connected with Venture Coaches -- entrepreneurs, lawyers, service providers, executives, investors, and others with professional expertise in the Southern California community and nationally -- to help them bring their ideas to market. Through Blackstone USC, UCLA, and UC Irvine have expanded their entrepreneurship and support programming while also serving as a gateway to an extensive network of mentors, experts, and services.

Blackstone LaunchPad UCLA is a free campus entrepreneurship program open to all UCLA students and alumni regardless of academic major. The program introduces entrepreneurship as a viable career path through individualized coaching, ideation, and venture creation support. Their services cover all industries and avenues of entrepreneurship, from for-profit ventures to non-profits and even ventures in the B corporation sector.

Housed within Covel Commons, the LaunchPad has a newly renovated office space that promotes collaboration and creativity. UCLA Bruins are able to talk with consulting staff about their venture ideas in a non-judgmental, confidential, and supportive space. Their program allows students to explore entrepreneurship at their own pace and to engage with the services offered in a personalized manner when developing their ventures throughout the academic year.

The one-on-one consulting meetings offered by the LaunchPad are enhanced by a variety of events, which include weekly discussions with thriving entrepreneurs, workshops to further develop entrepreneurial skills and mindsets, and provide exposure to the business community outside of UCLA.



ENTREPRENEUR FEATURE: Nandeet Mehta

With a Bachelor's Degree in History and a minor in Global Studies, on paper Nandeet Mehta is not the stereotypical entrepreneur. That did not stop him from pursuing his own personal business aspirations -- while also creating UCLA's VENTURE club; a student club that aims to develop a culture of startup thinking on UCLA's campus and facilitate entrepreneurship, business and finance among students by providing resources, networking, and mentorship.

Nandeet was able to create such a successful resource for students with the help of Blackstone LaunchPad UCLA. According to Nandeet, "Blackstone LaunchPad has been instrumental in assisting VENTURE in both scaling and thriving at UCLA! PYUR SOLUTIONS

Now, with the help of the LaunchPad, Nandeet has gone on to pursue his own company: Pyur Solutions. Pyur Solutions produces natural pest and home solutions that are nontoxic, biodegradable and use plant-based materials with no chemical additives.

The product uses proprietary botanical oil blends that attack octopamine neuro-receptor activity, thus killing and repelling a wide variety of household pests such as cockroaches, ants, dust mites, flies, wasps, spiders, crickets, and fleas. Pyur's blends of natural plant oils are every bit as effective as synthetic chemicals yet have no effect on people, pets, or the environment.

Today, Pyur Solutions is a full-fledged success story. Additionally, Pyur has filed multiple US patents that are currently pending and is planning to pursue foreign patents as well.

In addition to custom mentorship, they offer students access to a coworking space with a thriving, innovative environment and invaluable resources regardless of the stage of the idea and experience of the entrepreneur.

The LaunchPad, officially opened in the fall of 2014, was originally housed in USC's Annenberg School for Communication and Journalism. Within the first year, the LaunchPad transformed the existing restrictive offices to what is now the collaborative, entrepreneurial space known as the Annenberg Innovation Lab. Now, after two years, LaunchPad USC is moving across campus to the Marshall School of Business. This move will better integrate LaunchPad into the innovation community at USC. With an emphasis on entrepreneurship and innovation, collaborative research and social responsibility, and a global mindset, the USC Marshall School of Business is ideally positioned to address the challenges of a rapidly changing business environment and house the Blackstone LaunchPad at USC.



COMPANY FEATURE: Q-Cigarettes, Inc.

Q-Cigarettes is the first Quit Smoking iPhone App that delivers combination therapy, the most efficacious, evidence-based intervention to quit smoking. It is the first mobile app to offer counseling and nicotine replacement therapy (NRT) to help users and their loved ones successfully quit and stay quit.

The app combines counseling and nicotine replacement to give smokers the best chance to beat nicotine addiction. For instance, during high stress moments the Q-Cigarettes App can send text, pictures, or video message of support or counseling from a variety of sources, such as family and friends as your supporters, a pool of anonymous supporters, or even the app itself. The app also encourages the use of the tobacco-free, vapor-free Q-Cigarette Filters and nicotine gum available for purchase through the app to supplement the counseling.



As a medical student, a healthcare-oriented company played to founder Drew Park's strengths. The inspiration for the app hit when he began taking care of lung cancer and COPD patients. As a smoker himself with many family and friends that were as well Drew became immediately concerned with finding an accessible and enduring method for quitting smoking. Thus Q-Cigarettes was created -- but it was not until Drew entered USC's Blackstone LaunchPad that he was able to take it to the level of success that it has achieved today.

Through the LaunchPad, Drew was able to attend the CVS Retail & Health Innovation Challenge shown above at Wake Forest University in North Carolina. There he was able to meet and pitch Q-Cigarettes to industry executives and the world's best corporate retail innovators. Ultimately, he took home the first place prize and \$25,000 worth of funding to help grow his startup. The Q-Cigarettes app is now free-to-download on the Apple App Store.

The LaunchPad, housed in the ANTrepreneur Center on the second floor of the Student Center, is in an ideal, central location to entice UCI's entrepreneurial community. The center aims to turn UCI's Anteaters into Antrepreneurs by providing the diverse student body with a network of venture coaches and an entrepreneurial support system. By extending students free consultations and advice on how to turn their business dreams into realities the center fosters business endeavors and educates students on the possibility of pursuing a career as an entrepreneur.

COMPANY FEATURE: Guardian Locket

Meet Crystal Sanchez, a business economic major at UCI and member of UCI's class of 2019. She is the inventor of the Guardian Locket, a locket that poses as a fashionable necklace while deploying hidden circuit boards to help wearer dissuade and protect against potential attackers. With one click of a button on the back of the pendant, the locket will send a false call to the wearer's cellphone that is aimed to scare off a potential attacker. Another two clicks will send the wearer's exact location, their photo, and other relevant information to local authorities and three emergency contacts.

Crystal originally conceived of the locket during her senior year of high school when she discovered that her best friend had been raped during her first year of college. Because mace is illegal in many states, including her home state of California, Crystal realized that there needed to be a better alternative to help potential sexual assault victims.

Though the Guardian Locket had already made its debut -- winning Crystal first place in the Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship's 2015 National Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge accompanied by a visit to the White House and \$25,000 in funding -- Crystal was set on building the company as she moved to the next chapter of her life in college. UCI was the perfect fit.

"UCI was always my first choice," Crystal explained. With programs like the Blackstone LaunchPad at UCI, Crystal not only finds balance between her academic, social, and entrepreneurial lives but also receives the coaching and mentorship she needs to sustain and grow Guardian Locket.

With the funding she received and the entrepreneurial support offered at UCI she hopes to establish a line of Guardian Lockets in different lengths and metals including interchangeable faces. If all goes well, Crystal plans to expand her line to include chunky bracelets, statement necklaces, and even watches for men.

Though her product had previously been designed and produced, without Blackstone LaunchPad at UCI Crystal would not have the guidance and connections to expand her inventory, market her product, draft a new line, and network. Crystal and her Guardian Locket are living proof that no matter what stage of the entrepreneurial process, Blackstone LaunchPad at UCI helps students and their companies to thrive.



"The consulting at the Blackstone LaunchPad is great," says Alec. "It really helped with the business aspects of [the course] like business planning, how to price your product, how to get it to the most people possible, marketing, and press releases."

ENTREPRENEUR FEATURE: Alec Kriebel

UCI Computer Science major, freshman Alec Kriebel first demonstrated his entrepreneurialism in the fourth grade, when he established a small comics "company" with his classmates. "We would doodle comics during class. We wouldn't even copy them to hand them out. We would just sell the handmade comics. ... It was the first thing I did, business-wise," he says.

This enterprising attitude followed Alec to UCI, where he created a comprehensive "How to Develop iOS Apps" course before completing his first year. With 11 apps already published in the iOS app store, he conceived of a course that would guide novice beginners through the ins and outs of app development. He found a platform for his concept at Blackstone LaunchPad at UCI.

Alec was drawn to UCI as a place that would nurture his programming needs and entrepreneurialism. UCI was an ideal school for Alec, being positioned less than an hour from the city of Los Angeles and rapidly emerging as the next big hub for innovation.

Today Alec's app development course spans nine chapters with 68 total video lessons. From programming language lessons to User Interface (UI) design tutorials, Alec guides beginners through every aspect of app development with candor and ease. The course, sold in three different packages all under \$50, culminates with students' app releases in the iOS store.

Though he has found success with his video course and plans to maintain it, Alec is still focused on continued entrepreneurialism. "My dream is definitely founding entrepreneurial business," he says. "I really like making things that benefit people." Through Blackstone LaunchPad at UCI's resources, Alex will be able to fuel this dream, continuing to create and innovate.



LAEDC CENTER FOR INNOVATION

The LAEDC coordinates the LaunchPads programs at UCLA, UCI, and USC as regional partner with the Blackstone Charitable Foundation. Through this partnership, LAEDC has introduced new programs and events highlighting innovation and entrepreneurship in the region, leading to crucial exposure and networking opportunities for companies big and small. LAEDC connects the universities with each other, allowing resources and knowledge to be shared with multiple students across universities and regions, and facilitates access to a broader venture coaching community.



Blackstone's funding has been a catalyst for directed initiatives at LAEDC. In 2014 the Center for Innovation launched Innovate Los Angeles (inLA), with a mission to promote L.A. County as a leading global center for innovation and entrepreneurship rooted in boundless creativity and diversity.

InLA has led to numerous programs, most notably LA Innovation Week (LAIW), a county-wide annual celebration of the breadth of innovation within the greater region. In 2015, the Blackstone Charitable Foundation sponsored the event, helping LAEDC create and solidify over 75 partnerships with organizations and companies in the region who are dedicated to supporting and growing the innovation ecosystem in Los Angeles.






In addition to promoting and furthering Blackstone LaunchPad's reach and accessibility, LAEDC has worked to promote numerous organizations at the forefront of LA County's innovation economy. Among these companies is the Long Beach Innovation Team, a.k.a. i-team. The team was founded in May of 2015 and extends the City's capacity to rapidly advance research and development through a bold, data-driven and transparent approach to innovation.

The Center for Innovation has also worked to promote projects such as the Elevate Project of Los Angeles, a year-long program that pairs female startup founders with mentors from City of L.A. Mayor Garcetti's Tech Council and other high-level tech industry experts.

By raising awareness for the many innovative companies, programs, and events, the Center for Innovation is facilitating a culture of entrepreneurship and raising awareness of vital resources. In the years LAEDC has received Blackstone funding, the Center for Innovation has endorsed and partnered with over 70 companies, programs, and events to help popularize innovation and entrepreneurial information and resources.






