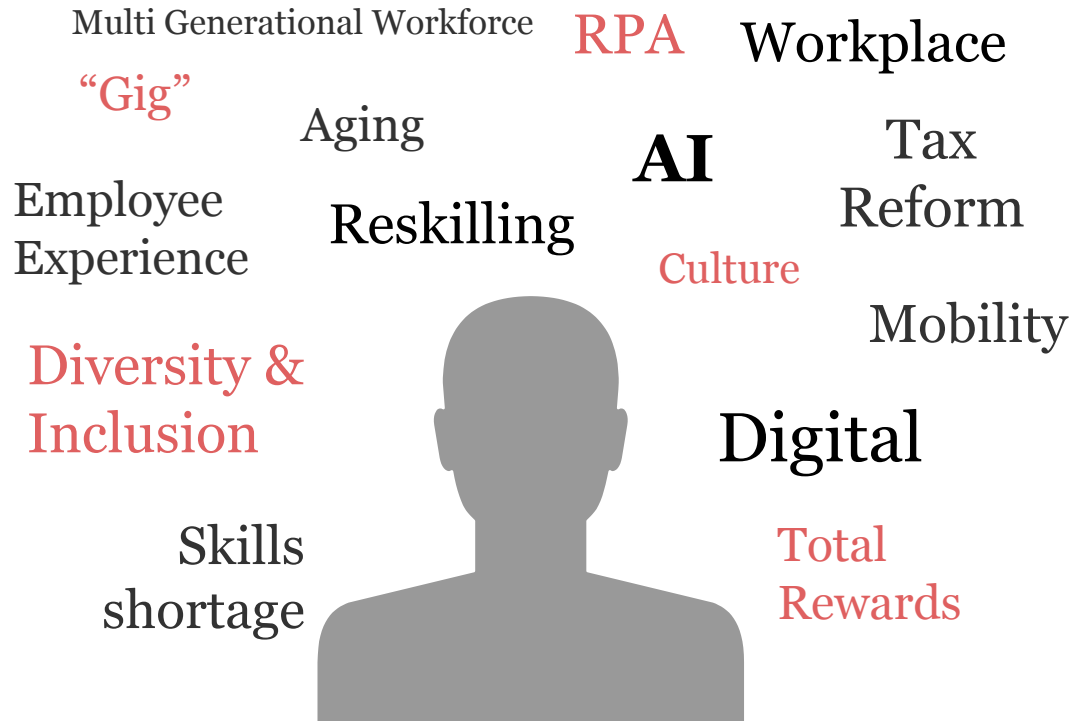


What are the key trends driving workforce disruption?

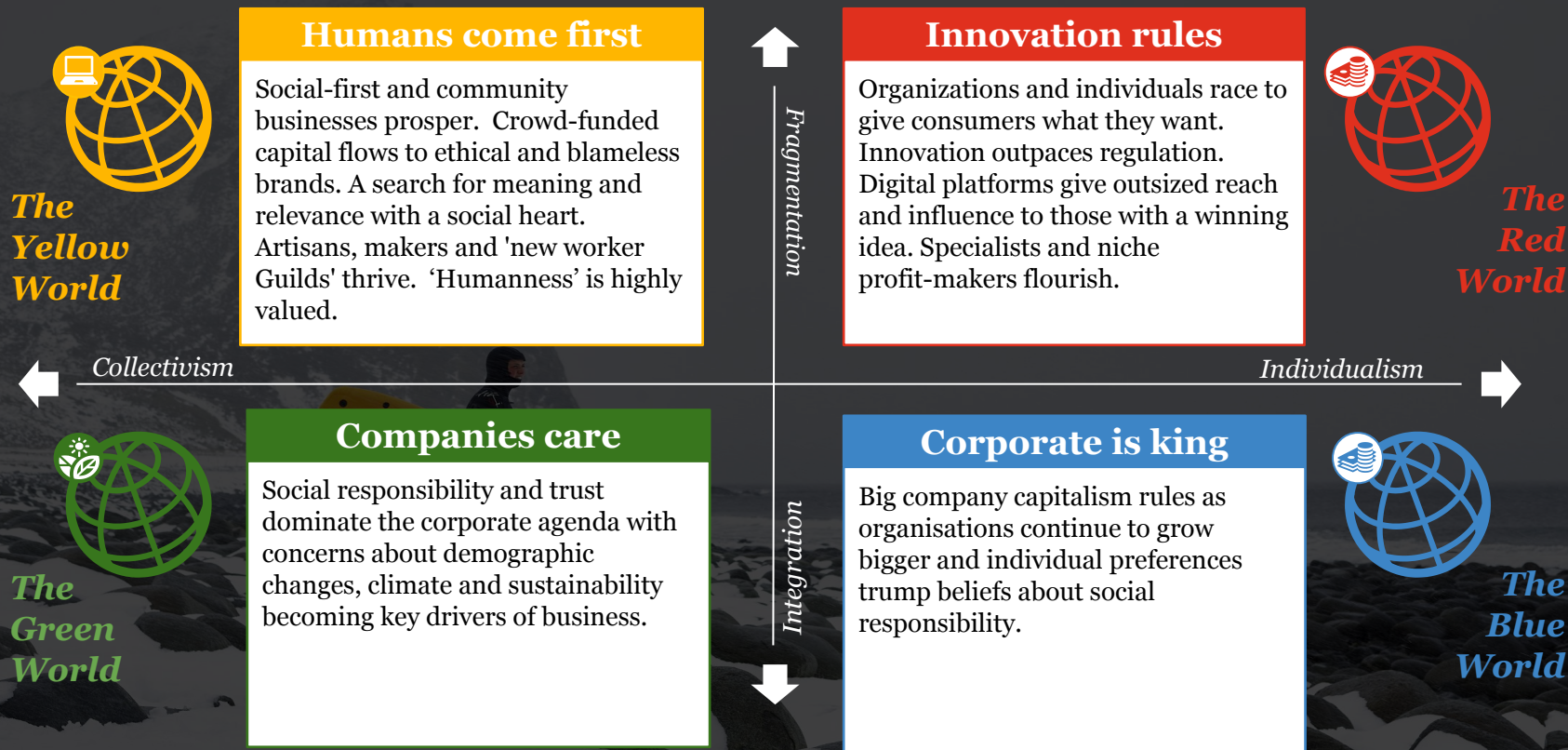
