
Since Our Last Webinar...

- No Travel advisory in effect


First U.S. COVID-19 Case First Stimulus Payments Start





Small Business Revenue in California


Percent Change in Small Business Revenue*




Real Gross Domestic Product

Year-over-year changes throughout the pandemic








Retail Trade in LA County

Activity levels at businesses throughout the pandemic




Leisure and Hospitality in LA County






Vaccine Distribution in LA County (as of 07/11/21)





Initial UI claims filed March 15, 2020, to week ending April 17, 2021, as a share of labor force


Unique Claimants, Regular UI and PUA

Regular UI Claims filed 3/14/2020 through week ending 6/19/21





(Labor force in millions)





Historical Monthly Employment Numbers


LA County Total Wage and Salary Employment



Month-over-month change in nonfarm employment



Month-Over-Month Change in Jobs by Industry, May 2021 - June 2021 (NSA)







Yearly Change in Payroll Employment by Sector Los Angeles County

Year-Over-Year Change in Jobs by







Year-Over-Year Change in Jobs by Industry, March 2019 through June 2021 (NSA)








Jobs Gain by Sector in Los Angeles County as a Share of Jobs Lost March-April 2020

Change in Jobs May 2020 - June 2021 as Share of Jobs Lost March 2020 - April 2020






Monthly Job Loss in Construction Since January 2020



Monthly Job Loss in LA County Since January 2020 in Professional Business Services






Monthly Job Loss in LA County Since January 2020 in Financial Activities



Monthly Job Loss in LA County Since January 2020 in Leisure and Hospitality




Monthly Job Loss in LA County Since January 2020 in Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation



Monthly Job Loss in LA County Since January 2020 in Accommodation and Food Services




Monthly Job Loss in LA Metro Area Since January 2020






Monthly Job Loss Since January 2020 – A Metro Area Comparison
